#### Types of Power


#### Classify items by:

- Power within—self-awareness/worth, realization of one's ability to act
- Power to—being able to create change and take action
- Power with—social power, capacity for collective action
- Power over—exerting control/influence over others


# DHS Gender-related Power Items by the Numbers




#### Power Items in DHS by Topic Area

#### How Have Power Measures Been Constructed

- Individual items as single measure
  - % women who used a bank account in past 12 months
- Composite scales
  - SDG Indicator 5.6.1 on SRH decision-making
  - SWPER Index

#### SDG Indicator 5.6.1

• Proportion of women age 15-49 years who make their own informed decisions regarding sexual relations, contraceptive use, and reproductive health care

#### SWPER: Survey based Women's EmPowERment index

- 3 domains:
  - Attitude to violence
  - Social independence
  - Decision-making
- Draws from violence attitudes, empowerment resources, economic empowerment, and household decision-making
- Weighted score for each domain

#### New in DHS-8



#### NEW in DHS-8: Gender and women's empowerment

- More questions on contraceptive decision making
  - More detail on joint decision making; questions are asked of more respondents now (all women in union, not just family planning users)
- Marriage certificates/marriage registration
- Duration of current union (for women married more than once)
- Who fetches water for the household
- Woman's use of a bank account for deposits/withdrawals
- Men: Did your father ever beat your mother?

#### Family planning/Reproductive health

- Menstrual hygiene
- Age at menarche
